THEME:

Nautical, incorporating the features of the area including a lighthouse Built in 1870 and still in use today, Auckland's Waitemata Harbour is proud to boast the oldest wooden lighthouse in New Zealand. The unique lighthouse was the inspiration for the bespoke playspace opened in 2020 in the vibrant seaside village of Devonport.

Engaged by Auckland Council to provide conceptual plans for a new playspace, WSPs focus very quickly turned to the natural seascape nearby and the focal point of the Waitemata Harbour – Bean Rock. Bean Rock features one of Auckland's Category One registered lighthouses, registered under the Historic Places Act. The inspiration for Windsor Park draws on the natural beauty of Bean Rock, its lighthouse and the surrounding reef and seascape.

The design brief focused on creating a scaled down version of the lighthouse standing at 8m tall.

Working together with our French partner Proludic, Playco created the tailored lighthouse to match the specification within the brief down to the millimeter.

With a specific colour pallet Playco were able to work with Proludic to ensure the lighthouse would be delivered exactly as required by the architect.



HANLEY'S FARM

QUEENSTOWN

Set in picturesque Queenstown, Hanley's Farm is located on a 3-kilometre stretch of land, sitting harmoniously between Lake Wakatipu, Deer Park Heights and The Remarkables.

A new family oriented sub-division, Hanley's Farm enjoys exquisite views from all aspects. Developer, RCL engaged Park Central to design the playspace. Park Central provided a concept design and requested a custom design that reflected the history of the surrounding areas, basing the design on a water-tower.

Approached by Park Central, Playco were asked to further the develop the design of a circular large wooden structure with three levels within; we were the only design team able to meet this intricate brief in every respect.





The brief included a round, wooden three-level tower, with slatted cladding to replicate that of an old water storage tower. The tower features two large slides that cater for different abilities and age ranges.

Meeting that element of the brief, the client and Park Central furthered the challenged us by asking for the design and build of a stainless steel connect swing that stood over 4m tall, to act as a beacon on the top of the hill. This swing became New Zealand's largest connect swings, guaranteed to thrill!



THEME:

Nature, acorns, autumn leaves and meandering streams Embracing the nature theme, Hastings District Council chose our GSWeb Acorn Tower for its main playspace feature. Working with Creo Architects, a theme of acorns, autumn leaves,

and meandering streams was conceptualised.

The oldest parkland in Hastings, Cornwall Park is home to hundreds of mature trees, some of which date back to the 1920s when

the park was first established.

Being a large piece in a small play space, the Acorn Tower provides a sense of scale. The 10m height of the structure allows climbers to be up in the trees, looking down on the playground below.

All equipment was designed to wrap around the main structure, providing different play experiences for children to discover as they move through the play space.

When selecting the equipment for the play space, equipment was chosen that not only covered a wide range of ages, but also a range of abilities. Equipment such as inground mini-trampolines, ramped play structures with sensory panels, and large open basket swings, all provide accessible play options.

Putting a natural twist on the concept of play using soft colours, gardens and landscaping to blend the new features into the park, Milverton is a wonderland for children to explore. The equipment was crafted out of natural materials where possible, while the design encourages parents to get involved with their children. The high-rise fort was designed to give children the feeling of being up amongst the trees.

The gardens that would form a soft, safety boundary around and under the play equipment would be part of the set-up, with children free to touch and feel the growing plants.

Water, ecology, refuge, connection, events & history

Designed to be a retreat on the fringes of Auckland city centre, Western Springs new playspace celebrates the significant ecological area.

Called an Ecological Escape, the modernised space includes play equipment and zoned areas of play suitable for children of all ages and abilities.

Western Spings sits in a green corridor, with the park surrounded by the popular regional facilities of Auckland Zoo, MOTAT and Western Springs Stadium.

Meandering pathways between the play zones double as beginner bike riding tracks. New and improved pathways, seating, BBQs, drinking fountains, shade sails and shade trees also feature. Accessibility is prioritised with a combination of new surfaces introduced; the removal of steps and ridges to make sure wheelchairs, prams and those with impaired mobility can use the play area easily.



As the park is partially fenced, Auckland Council wanted a feature piece of equipment to be seen from the road above. Our wooden tower has two level and two slides


















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
